

## Attachment 1

At least 18 state contracts include a no-cost, wireless provision and will require no federal subsidy. In California, New Mexico and Idaho the state and farmers market organizations do excellent outreach and most FM/DMF take advantage of the equipment/service. In the other states most FM/DMF are not aware of the no-cost option and have enrolled in FNS-sponsored “free equipment” programs or raised money to access equipment. Column 3 estimates the number of FM/DMF in each state that either have equipment that no longer works or who will be facing the full cost of equipment/service as they age out of a FNS-subsidized program. With adequate outreach many of these FM/DMF will choose the EBT-only equipment provided through the state contract. Those that want additional services can choose it at their own expense.

<sup>1</sup> In many states FM/DMF do not know that there is a no-cost, wireless option available. Some of these markets will choose to pay for service that includes credit and debit cards, others will opt for EBT-only equipment available through the State contract. There is no need for additional FNS device funding in these states.

<sup>2</sup> Hawaii and Georgia have caps on the number of no-cost devices available. We assume that all active FM/DMF in the state will choose a no-cost option if available.
